**Mayor DeFillippo amended the order of the agenda to provide the following Community Update:**

Community Update  
June 29, 2021

- Good evening and welcome to the Township Council's first in person, open-to-the-public meeting we have held in 15 months. On behalf of the Township Council, I want to welcome the public back to town hall for our meeting. It certainly is nice to see people in our audience.
- As a reminder, the public is invited to attend our meetings without social distancing and without wearing a mask. However, unvaccinated people are strongly encouraged to wear masks. It is your choice. More on this later.
- Also, as a reminder, we will continue to stream our meetings live through Zoom – audio and video – for the foreseeable future. There are still some among us who are uncomfortable with being in public spaces.
- Our COVID-19 update continues to be positive. Since our last meeting, the number of people who have contracted COVID went from 2,544 to 2553. Just 9 new cases. That is great news, keeping in mind that at this stage, only one case is too many.
- We got to this place because we were strong as a community and we wore our masks, followed the social distancing and safety guidelines from our health care professional, and were vaccinated – even when we were sick and tired of those rules and restrictions.
- On a cautionary note, our Health Department tells us the only people who have contracted COVID in the past two weeks in Roxbury were people who have not been vaccinated.
- Now, I personally believe it is important to respect the individual decisions people make without criticism or judgement. But I also think it is important to urge people to get vaccinated to help finally put an end to the spread of COVID in our community.
- You may not be concerned about the impact COVID might have on your health. We ask that you remember that children under 12 cannot yet be vaccinated and it remains critical that we do all that we can to protect them from contracting COVID.
- Please, get vaccinated so that we can continue to return to normal.

- As incentive, I offer several events since our last meeting that provide evidence that we are returning to normal and how good that feels.
- The first was a lovely celebration of life for our former friend and Ward 1 Councilman Rich Zoschak. It was held outdoors on a beautiful day at the Pavilion at Horseshoe Lake on his birthday, June 19. Nearly 200 people attended to hear Rich’s friends and his wife Diana talk about Rich’s life and contributions to our community.
- It was a fitting tribute and I want to thank Deputy Mayor Fred Hall, Councilwoman Jaki Albrecht, and Michele O’Halloran from the Township Manager’s Office, who worked with Diana to put the event together.
- I was also immensely proud and honored to attend this year’s Roxbury High School graduation, which was held outside on the football field on Thursday, June 24. It was a beautiful, sunny day and it was gratifying to look up in the stands to see so many unmasked happy people. It felt like we were returning to normal – it felt great.
- Congratulations to the graduates and to all the adults who helped these outstanding young people achieve this important milestone in their lives.
- With that, thank you for joining us tonight. Now let us return to our agenda.

Ms. Bock extended condolences to the family and Council on the loss of Councilman Richard Zoschak. She commented that the recent Celebration of Life in honor of Councilman Zoschak was a beautiful event. Council members expressed their appreciation and gratitude toward veterans for their service and sacrifices. Mr. Shepherd spoke of banner programs in other states and will explore possible options for Roxbury.

**Keith Griffin, 501 Main Street, Landing** *(in attendance remotely via Zoom)* – Mr. Griffin spoke about the recent notification sent to Landing residents regarding PFOA and PFOS exceedances that resulted in the shutdown of Well #2. General discussion occurred with regard to informing residents of such situations as quickly as possible. Mr. Shepherd and Mayor DeFillippo noted that Roxbury opted to take an ultra-conservative approach and take the well offline even though the levels were not at a point that statutorily mandated such action. Mayor DeFillippo said Roxbury is fortunate to be able to take such an action and still have the ability to service the needs of the community. Mr. Griffin asked if Teflon will be eliminated from water tanks/systems. Mr. Shepherd said that the Township is committed to identifying the source of the Well #2 issue.
